Dean Millsap currently coordinates and manages international business development activities for Boeing rotorcraft in Asia. He is responsible for promoting, coordinating and managing the sale of the CH-47 Chinook, AH-64D Apache Longbow and V-22 Osprey rotorcraft to support the combat helicopter requirements in the Asia region.

Millsap joined the heritage McDonnell Douglas Helicopter Company in 1988 as a Training Analyst Designer responsible for developing and revising all training materials related to the U.S. Army's Apache training program. In 1989, he was selected to manage the Manpower and Personnel Integration (MANPRINT) for the AH-64D Apache Longbow, which included integrating training, human factors and systems engineering disciplines into the Apache Longbow design.

In 1990 he was selected to manage the Asia-Pacific region for the new Apache International Business Development Division. His responsibilities included promoting the AH-64 Apache capability and value to countries in the region which included Singapore, Japan and Korea. He also played a vital role in successful Apache campaigns in the United Kingdom, The Netherlands, and the Middle East.

Prior to his current assignment, he resided in Asia for five years as the Asia-Pacific Regional Director. This included a two year assignment in Singapore where he was the business development lead and attack helicopter subject matter expert in support of the Peace Vanguard Program.

Millsap served in the U.S. Army from 1967 to 1988 and retired as a senior Army officer and master Army aviator. He accumulated more than 6,200 hours of flying time in attack helicopters (AH-1 Cobra and AH-64A Apache), of which 4,500 hours were as a Standardization Instructor Pilot and 1,100 hours were combat experience. His last Army assignment was as an AH-64A Apache Standardization Instructor Pilot for the Directorate of Standardization at the U.S. Army Aviation Center, Ft. Rucker, Ala.

Millsap holds a bachelor's degree in aeronautical science from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University.
