

LOCAL CORPORATE GRANT-MAKING GUIDELINES: ARIZONA

<p>Are unsolicited grants accepted or do I need an invitation code?</p>	<p>Organizations need an invitation code to submit a grant request. Please discuss your proposal first with the Boeing Arizona Global Corporate Citizenship representative (Mary Baldwin at 480-891-4441) to determine eligibility. If eligible, the next step is a pre-application Letter of Inquiry (LOI).</p>
<p>If I need an invitation code, how do I acquire one?</p>	<p>Non-profits should contact the Boeing Arizona Global Corporate Citizenship representative (listed above) to discuss your program and how it might fit the company charitable strategies.</p>
<p>Do you only accept proposals only during specific timeframes or may I apply at anytime?</p>	<p>After determining eligibility and LOI approval, organizations are invited to submit an application. LOIs are accepted in the third and fourth quarters each year with application invitations extended in the first and second quarters of the next year.</p>
<p>Which of the five Boeing focus areas does your site support? Boeing: Corporate Focus Areas/Objectives</p>	<p>All five focus areas are supported.</p>
<p>Does your local grant making concentrate on specific issues within the standard Boeing focus areas? Boeing: Corporate Focus Areas/Objectives</p>	<p>We work within the five Boeing focus area objectives to develop a site-specific plan tailored to the particular needs of the Phoenix-Mesa community.</p> <p>Overall, our charitable investment decisions are based on identifiable outcomes that provide the maximum benefit to the community and that meet real needs in the short term, but can have broader positive effects beyond the period of our involvement.</p> <p>To determine those investments, we have a process that looks first at a program's expected results and next for demonstrations of innovation and collaboration. Specifically, grant requests are evaluated on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alignment with our Corporate Focus Area Objectives, company values and core competencies • Clearly defined expected outcomes relative to community needs, that are measurable, scalable, and have a sustainable impact on the community beyond the period of the company's involvement • The extent to which the project or program demonstrates innovation, collaboration, leadership and diversity • The organization's financial viability, programmatic strength, and legal compliance
<p>Do you accept requests for in-kind donations and if so, what do you generally donate?</p>	<p>Yes, we do accept in-kind donation requests. However, resources are limited so we ask that you inquire by e-mail to the Boeing Arizona Global Corporate Citizenship representative.</p>
<p>May I apply for multiple Boeing resources? (i.e., Corporate cash grants, Employee Community Fund (ECF), business sponsorships and in-kind resources?)</p>	<p>Yes, you may apply for multiple Boeing resources, but we strive to not duplicate corporate cash grants and ECF grants to non-profits. Again, resources are limited, so we ask that you send inquiries to the Boeing Arizona Global Corporate Citizenship representative.</p>

May I request employee volunteer support whether or not I request a cash grant?	Yes. Please direct requests to the Boeing Arizona Global Corporate Citizenship representative.
How do I submit a request for a Boeing Executive to serve on my organization's board of directors?	Please contact the Boeing Arizona Global Corporate Citizenship representative listed below.
If I call or email with a general questions, how soon can I expect a response?	You can expect a reply to phone messages and e-mails within 48-72 hours, but your patience is appreciated.
Once I submit my grant application when will I hear if it has been approved?	You will be notified within 30 days.
