

Local Guidelines for Grants and Other Resources for **California (2012):**

<p>Are unsolicited grants accepted or do I need an invitation code?</p>	<p>Unsolicited grant requests are not generally accepted for our Global Corporate Citizenship (GCC) grants in California. Invitation codes are required to submit a formal LOI/grant application.</p> <p>If you are seeking support from the Employee Community Fund of Boeing California (ECF) please see the information at the bottom of this document.</p>
<p>If I need an invitation code, how do I acquire one?</p>	<p>Our Community Investors work through existing networks and partners to identify the organizations and programs with whom we wish to work. There are many opportunities to meet our Community Investors in the community at events/conferences/convenings centered on their particular focus area. If you are not actively pursuing such opportunities in the community and wish to seek support from Boeing, please see the instructions further down the page on how to submit information.</p> <p>After determining if there is significant alignment with funding objectives, an invitation code will be provided. Invitation codes are used for the formal online application process through our Cybergrants system.</p>
<p>Do you accept proposals only during specific timeframes or may I apply at anytime?</p>	<p>If there is an interest in partnering with your organization, you will be asked to complete a formal Letter of Intent (LOI). After feedback on the LOI is provided, grant seekers receive an invitation code to complete the online application through our Cybergrants system. Currently, <u>those communities are all in Southern California.</u></p>

All the information about the objectives of our grantmaking, types of support and our service area can be found here. 2. Examine the Focus Area Objectives corresponding to the focus area under which your programs fall. These objectives list the types of programs which we can fund through this function. WE DO NOT FUND PROGRAMS THAT FALL OUTSIDE THESE OBJECTIVES. 3. Email the Community Investor listed for the Focus Area. The email should indicate that you have examined this Guidelines Document and should provide a brief and clear indication of how your programs support the listed Focus Area Objective(s). 4. If your programs appear to be an appropriate fit and if resources are available, the Community Investor will contact you to discuss follow-up. 5. After detailed follow-up and discussion, if significant interest exists, the Community Investor will then invite you to submit a formal, online LOI.
<p>Does your local grantmaking concentrate on specific objectives within the focus areas? Boeing: Corporate Focus Areas/Objectives</p>	<p>Below are the objectives for each of our focus areas. The objectives were determined by an extensive process of community needs analysis in consultation with external and internal stakeholders. The objectives represent the types of programs which we can fund. We <u>do not</u> provide funding for programs that are not aligned with these objectives.</p> <p>ARTS & CULTURE</p> <p>Boeing believes an education which includes the arts provides students with the skills and abilities to succeed in life and navigate careers in the 21st century. Boeing investments during 2012 and 2013 will continue to support the advancement of two county-wide initiatives, Arts for All and Arts Advantage, to bring arts education back into the classroom and available for all students in Los Angeles and Orange Counties.</p> <p>We will focus our support on organizations who work in collaboration or partnership to directly support the Arts for All or Arts Advantage initiatives. This will include support to school districts, government agencies and arts partners focusing on programs that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enable school districts to adopt policies, plans and budgets for quality, standards-based arts education delivered in the classroom • Support Arts for All or Arts Advantage school districts in their ability to advance and/or deepen their work • Provide professional development for teachers and administrators • Support and promote advocacy for arts education • Deliver standards-based arts education in the classroo <p>Boeing will monitor the progress as collaborations/partnerships are formed to develop a county-wide initiative in San Diego County. With limited resources to invest in the Civic focus area, Boeing will focus efforts in two areas--leadership development within underserved communities and increasing the understanding of our diverse communities. We will look for opportunities to assist our partner-profit organizations in developing the talent within their organizations to help them increase their effectiveness and their networks. We will pay particular attention to organizations from diverse and underserved communities; individuals with unique paths to leadership coupled with high potential for personal impact; programs to assist organizations with better understanding of how to better address financial issues that affect capacity building; and programs that have regional approach to leadership issues.

We will also look for opportunities to invest in programs that highlight the impacts of diverse communities. These may include educational outreach surrounding exhibitions, conferences or convenings.

Funding opportunities are only made on an invitation basis and unsolicited requests are not accepted.

EDUCATION**EARLY LEARNING**

Boeing supports programs benefiting traditionally underserved families and communities in California that have the least access to quality early childhood education. Boeing investments:

- Increase parental and caregiver knowledge and skills to nurture a child's social, emotional and cognitive development.
- Improve the professional development of diverse center based teachers and family child care providers.
- Promote public awareness on the benefits of quality early learning by engaging families, providers, policymakers, the media and other stakeholders and developing leaders to shape better education policy and resource allocation state wide, particularly for those from disadvantaged and minority backgrounds.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY EDUCATION

Boeing supports systemic and results-oriented programs that prepare students in California for success in college, career and life. Boeing investments:

- Enhance math and science educator professional development. Programs should be intensive, ongoing and sustainable; focused on specific academic content; connected to practice; mission driven and aligned with other district initiatives; collaborative and system-wide; reflective, including mentoring or peer coaching; and related to achievement gains for all students.
- Increase the number of quality math and science educators, specifically in under performing schools and districts.
- Recruit, develop, and retain dynamic and diverse education leaders such as principals, curriculum specialists, superintendents and school board members who can drive transformation in under performing schools and districts.

- Promote hands-on and inquiry-based math and science content that is rigorous, aligned to the Common Core standards, enhances science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) competencies, and relevant to STEM workforce needs.

ENVIRONMENTAL

Boeing looks for opportunities to support specific efforts in three areas of concern to our community: Water, Urban Community Health and Environmental Education. The programs supported should exhibit each of the following three aspects: Awareness, Education and Action. Programs should seek to: 1) provide awareness of specific environmental concerns for program participants; 2) provide educational opportunities for program participants to understand what can be done to address the specific environmental concerns; and 3) require measureable action on the part of program participants. Of particular interest are programs that target underserved populations or educators who work with underserved populations.

Water

- Programs that support the development and implementation of water conservation and rainwater capture systems--this includes consumer education efforts on how to reduce water consumption and implement new technologies in their households. Particular attention will be paid to programs that address underserved communities in our region.
- Support efforts that protect our coastal and inland waterways and the surrounding habitats through community education with specific attention paid to the connection to water conservation and clean water efforts.

Urban Community Health

- Programs that educate youth, families, community leaders and businesses on environmental issues and their impact on the health of the community. These types of education programs are not school curriculum- or standards-based and are delivered outside the traditional classroom setting that lead participants to take action in changing or modifying environmental behavior.

Environmental Education

- Programs that support and advance environmental studies in our schools. Our goal is to provide a continuum of services from Early Childhood through the traditional K-12 Classroom. As with our Education Focus Area, the emphasis will be on teacher and educator professional development.

<p>May I request employee volunteer support regardless of whether or not I request a cash grant?</p>	<p>Yes, however, priority is given to those projects that have a demonstrated interest with our employee volunteers and whose outreach address directly those issues outlined above with regard to the areas where we concentrate. <p>How do I submit a request for a Boeing executive to serve on my organization's board of directors?</p>	<p>Board support is provided for current grantees and potential partner organizations whose missions and programs align with our strategic investing objectives. Please contact Vanessa.Pereda@boeing.com.</p>
<p>If I call or email with general questions, how soon may I expect a response?</p>	<p>Because of the volume of requests, we cannot respond to all inquiries. This is not meant to be a determination of the value of your programs, but rather our abilities to support a wide region with limited resources. Depending on the nature of your inquiry and the time of year, we will make every effort to respond to or acknowledge your inquiry within five (5) days of receipt.</p>

<p>Once I submit my grant application, when will I be notified of a decision?</p>	<p>Please see the specific focus area objective, above, to determine the response time.</p>
