

Local Guidelines for Grants and Other Resources for **FLORIDA**:

<p>Are unsolicited grants accepted or do I need an invitation code?</p>	<p>Unsolicited grants are accepted, but we only consider requests for projects that benefit the Kennedy Space Center / Brevard County (majority of funding), Fort Walton Beach (2nd), and Cecil Field / Duval County / Jacksonville (3rd) areas. (State-wide initiatives will be considered as long as they also benefit these areas). Get the formal online CyberGrant application here (www.cybergrants.com/boeing/US).</p>
<p>If I need an invitation code, how do I acquire one?</p>	<p>An invitation code is not required, but please be sure your request aligns with the state focus area objectives below before applying. If you have questions, please contact Debbie Kelly.</p>
<p>Do you accept proposals only during specific timeframes or may I apply at anytime?</p>	<p>We will accept grant requests only through Thursday, April 30, 2009.</p> <p>NOTE: Sponsorship, business donation or membership requests for FLORIDA are not submitted through a grant application. For consideration, these requests must be submitted by Sept. 30 for the following calendar year at: http://www.cybergrants.com/pls/cybergrants/ao_login.login?x_gm_id=2757&x_proposal_type_id=8832</p> <p>IMPORTANT: You MUST use the Invitation Code: FLSponsors when submitting a request for a sponsorship in the state of FLORIDA</p>
<p>What is the average size of your cash grants?</p>	<p>It can vary (\$1,000 up to \$10,000) depending on geographical area and focus area targeted</p>
<p>Which of the five Boeing focus areas does your site support? Boeing: Corporate Focus Areas/Objectives</p>	<p>2009: Education Health & Human Services (H&HS) Arts & Culture (A&C) Environment</p>
<p>Does your local grantmaking concentrate on specific issues within the focus areas? Boeing: Corporate Focus Areas/Objectives</p>	<p>Education: K-12: To fund programs that support promoting teacher professional development and improving school leadership and "Improving outcomes for the largest number of students possible, including targeted investments for underserved populations to continue to narrow the achievement gap among major student groups, with a focus on math, science, and literacy." To fund programs that align curriculum (math, science, literacy) across certain grade levels throughout the district. Priority will be given to programs that can use our contribution as local match to draw down state, federal, and other private funding. Early Learning: To fund programs that provide continuing professional development to assist local child care providers and families to enhance the cognitive, social, emotional and physical development of children. Priority will be given to programs that can use our contribution as local match to draw down state, federal, and other private funding.</p> <p>H&HS: To fund innovative and collaborative programs that work to break the cycle of poverty through</p>

	<p>job training, collaborations that coordinate healthcare services, economic self-sufficiency, affordable housing, and that improve the efficiency of food, housing, and /or healthcare systems for vulnerable populations. Priority will be given to programs that can use our contribution as local match to draw down state, federal, and other private funding.</p> <p>Arts & Culture: We will support school districts, government agencies, and arts partners focusing on programs that support school districts' quality standards-based arts education integrated in the school day for all students as well as direct, standards-based arts education services in the classroom that are tied to Florida Sunshine State Standards; invest in programs that are developed to create a more sustainable arts and cultural environment - such as workshops, marketing & collaboration opportunities - that will benefit many local arts & cultural organizations; and promote innovative performances and exhibitions, particularly those that introduce new voices and promote appreciation of different cultures. Priority will be given to programs that can use our contribution as local match to draw down state, federal, and other private funding.</p> <p>Environment: Our local plan is to protect critical natural assets and restore or improve critical habitat. Priority will be given to programs that can use our contribution as local match to draw down state, federal, and other private funding.</p>
<p>Do you accept requests for in-kind donations and if so, what do you generally donate?</p>	<p>Brevard County/KSC Area: Yes, we do in-kind donations, but it is usually by a “push” method rather than by a request. We have donated computer hardware, furniture, miscellaneous surplus office supplies. If you would like to be on our email list for notification of an upcoming distribution, please notify Debbie Kelly. You must align with our charitable focus area objectives and be a 501c3 for consideration. If you are from the Fort Walton Beach or Jacksonville area, your inquiry will be forwarded from someone in that area to contact you.</p>
<p>May I apply for multiple Boeing resources? (Corporate Cash Grants, Employees Community Fund (ECF), Business Sponsorships, Employee Volunteers, etc.)</p>	<p>Yes, you may apply for multiple Boeing resources but all other Boeing contributions to your organization will be considered when determining your request for a corporate charitable contribution.</p>
<p>May I request employee volunteer support regardless of whether or not I request a cash grant?</p>	<p>Yes, we always consider volunteer opportunities, but may have to decline the offer if we feel we cannot support due to other commitments. Please email Debbie Kelly for the Community Involvement Request form. If you are from the Fort Walton Beach or Jacksonville area, your inquiry will be forwarded for someone in that area to contact you.</p>
<p>How do I submit a request for a Boeing executive to serve on my</p>	<p>Contact Debbie Kelly. Consideration will be determined by alignment to our state’s charitable and business objectives, past and future partnership, and if the personnel is available to support. If you are from the Fort Walton Beach or Jacksonville area, your inquiry may be forwarded from someone in those areas to contact you.</p>

Once I submit my grant application, when will I be notified of a decision?	<p>For corporate charitable requests, due diligence will be performed during May / early June, final determinations made, with notifications going out mid to late June.</p> <p>For sponsorships, as we ask they be submitted by Sept. 30 for the following year, requests will be approved, or declined, by they date you enter into the system as the final due date, and you will be notified accordingly.</p>
