

LOCAL CORPORATE GRANT-MAKING GUIDELINES: ISRAEL

<p>Are unsolicited grants accepted or do I need an invitation code?</p>	<p>While unsolicited grants are accepted, it is necessary that you contact the local Boeing Global Corporate Citizenship (GCC) Representative prior to submission to discuss your request for funding and to obtain an invitation code. See below</p>
<p>If I need an invitation code, how do I acquire one?</p>	<p>Yes, an invitation code is required in order to formally apply for a grant. Please contact us to find out if your proposed project aligns with our current year's community investment strategy</p>
<p>Do you only accept proposals only during specific timeframes or may I apply at anytime?</p>	<p>Yes, grant applications are accepted only during a specific timeframe each year. Application Period (for all focus areas): February 1 – June 30. Evaluation of Grant Requests: July 1 – August 20 Grant Approvals and Payment Processing: September 1 – September 10 Grant Payments Distributed: October 1 – November 30</p>
<p>Which of the five Boeing focus areas does your site support? Boeing: Corporate Focus Areas/Objectives</p>	<p>We accept grant applications in all five focus areas</p>
<p>Does your local grant making concentrate on specific issues within the standard Boeing focus areas? Boeing: Corporate Focus Areas/Objectives</p>	<p>We do not have additional specifications within the focus areas. But we do base our charitable investment decisions on identifiable outcomes that promise to provide the maximum benefit to the community. We are interested in funding requests that meet real needs in the short run and that are likely to have broader positive effects beyond the period of our involvement. To determine those investments, we use a competitive process that looks first at a program's expected results and next for demonstrations of innovation and collaboration. Specifically, grant requests are evaluated on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alignment with our Corporate Focus Area Objectives, company values and core competencies; • Clearly defined expected outcomes relative to community needs, that are measurable, scalable, and have a sustainable impact on the community beyond the period of the company's involvement; • The extent to which the project or program demonstrates innovation, collaboration, leadership, and diversity
<p>Do you accept requests for in-kind donations and if so, what do you generally donate?</p>	<p>We generally do not make in-kind donations.</p>
<p>May I apply for multiple Boeing resources? (i.e., Corporate cash grants, Employee Community Fund (ECF), business sponsorships and in-kind resources?)</p>	<p>We have elected to support organizations primarily through Corporate Cash Grants at this time.</p>
<p>May I request employee volunteer support whether or not I request a cash grant?</p>	<p>We do not coordinate employee volunteerism at this time</p>

How do I submit a request for a Boeing Executive to serve on my organization's board of directors?	You may contact the Israel GCC Representative to discuss your ideas.
If I call or email with a general questions, how soon can I expect a response?	Due to volume, email queries are typically responded to within 10 working days. Your patience is appreciated
Once I submit my grant application when will I hear if it has been approved?	Applicants are usually notified of a decision within 60 days of submission.
