<p>Are unsolicited grants accepted or do I need an invitation code?</p>	<p>You are required to obtain an invitation code. Grants are considered for organizations located in Central Ohio.</p>
<p>If I need an invitation code, how do I acquire one?</p>	<p>Contact the community investor (see contact information below). Upon acceptance of a proposal the invitation code is issued.</p>
<p>Do you accept proposals only during specific timeframes or may I apply at anytime?</p>	<p>Charitable contributions proposals are accepted March 1 through July 1.</p> <p>All sponsorship requests for benefits, galas and fund-raisers are due by Sept. 30 for the following calendar year by contacting the community investor. Invitation codes are not issued for sponsorships.</p>
<p>What is the average size of your cash grants?</p>	<p>Our grants vary. We base our award levels on the alignment (to focus area objectives) and merit of each individual grant request.</p>
<p>Which of the five Boeing focus areas does your site support? Boeing: Corporate Focus Areas/Objectives</p>	<p>K-12 Education Health & Human Services Arts & Culture</p>
<p>Does your local grantmaking concentrate on specific issues within the focus areas? Boeing: Corporate Focus Areas/Objectives</p>	<p>K-12: Promote teacher professional development and improve school leadership</p> <p>Health & Human Services: Community-based programs that address disparities in healthcare and projects that improve the efficiency of health and human services systems, including food, housing, and healthcare</p> <p>Arts & Culture: Performances and exhibitions that introduce new voices and perspectives to our community, collaborative efforts developed to create a more sustainable arts and cultural environment, and programs that engage people to become lifelong arts and cultural participants, patrons or practitioners.</p> <p>Overall, we base our charitable investment decisions on expected results that provide the maximum benefit to and for the community, that meet real needs in the short run but can have broader positive effects beyond the time of our involvement. We use a process that looks first at a program's expected results and next for demonstrations of what we believe are the hallmarks of good community investments. Specifically, grant requests are evaluated on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alignment with our company values and core competencies • Clearly defined expected outcomes, relative to community needs, that are measurable, scalable, and have a sustainable impact on the community beyond the period of the company's involvement • The extent to which the project or program demonstrates innovation, collaboration, leadership and diversity

Do you accept requests for in-kind donations and if so, what do you generally donate?	Yes – only computer-related equipment on an intermittent basis
May I apply for multiple Boeing resources? (Corporate Cash Grants, Employees Community Fund (ECF), Business Sponsorships, Employee Volunteers, etc.)	Yes. Contact the community investor (see contact information below).
May I request employee volunteer support regardless of whether or not I request a cash grant?	Yes, we have volunteer programs throughout the year.
