Apply for a Grant: Oklahoma City

Introduction

The Employees Community Fund (ECF) of Oklahoma City is part of an international network of Boeing employee-owned and operated nonprofit charitable foundations that funds primarily health & human services organizations. Agencies must fall within the requirements of Section 170(c) of the Internal Revenue Code and must also qualify with the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3) organization.

Grants awarded in the Oklahoma City area vary greatly in size, depending on the nature of the request.

Geographical Restrictions

Agencies must be located in or have significant operations in Oklahoma in order to be considered for funding.

Timeline

Proposals are accepted throughout the year. Decisions are generally made within 30 days of proposal receipt. Agencies will be notified when a decision has been made.

Restrictions

The ECF of Oklahoma City does not fund:

- Political organizations or programs
- Fraternal, sectarian, social, religious, churches or similar groups.
- Tax-supported endeavors, except joint government and private enterprise projects
- Private foundations
- Trips or tours
- Courtesy advertising, fundraising events, conference or dinner tickets
- Service club activities
- Endowments
- Youth sports groups

Instructions for Applying for ECF Funding

Agencies must apply using Boeing's online grant application. Hardcopy applications will not be accepted. The link to the on-line application is below.

An invitation code is required for the ECF of Oklahoma City. Invitation codes are given to agencies after the ECF has determined that the agency meets its charitable investment strategy.

Agencies are not allowed to submit more than one application per calendar year.
