<p>Are unsolicited grants accepted or do I need an invitation code?</p>	<p>No invitation code is needed. Grant application decisions will be made based on the grants merit, the organizations tax status, and alignment with the strategies listed below.</p>
<p>If I need an invitation code, how do I acquire one?</p>	<p>N/A</p>
<p>Do you only accept proposals during specific timeframes?</p>	<p>Grant requests are accepted any time of the year.</p>
<p>What is the average size of your cash grants?</p>	<p>Grant sizes generally range from \$1,000 to \$5,000.</p>
<p>Do you accept requests for in-kind donations and if so, what do you generally donate?</p>	<p>in-kind resources are not generally not available</p>
<p>Can I apply for Boeing corporate, ECF, sponsorships and in-kind resources?</p>	<p>Agencies may apply for an ECF grant as well as a corporate grant, in-kind resources are not generally not available.</p>
<p>If I call or email with a general question, how soon will someone get back to me?</p>	<p>We generally try to answer questions the same day.</p>
<p>Once I submit my grant application when will I hear if it's been approved?</p>	<p>Generally it takes up to six weeks to receive a grant. If the grant has been declined, the agency should know within two or three weeks.</p>
