Joe Hoerter is Vice President, F-15 Program for Boeing's Integrated Defense Systems. He has been with Boeing for more than 17 years. His initial assignment was as Director, Advanced Aircraft Vehicles where he directed classified/proprietary IR&D programs aimed at developing and exploiting critical high leverage technologies. Mr. Hoerter has been the executive responsible for several advanced technology fighter programs, including the international X-31 Enhanced Fighter Maneuverability Demonstrator. He became the F-15 Program Director in January 2000.

Prior to joining Boeing, Mr. Hoerter completed a distinguished 20-year career in the United States Air Force. At retirement, Mr. Hoerter was the Chief of the Weapons System Division, Air Force Office of Legislative Liaison, at the Pentagon, serving as the primary interface between the Air Force and Armed Services Committees involving Air Force Weapons Systems. Earlier, Mr. Hoerter was Chief of Air Vehicles Division, Low Observables Directorate, at the Pentagon where he served as Air Staff Manager for the B-1B Bomber, the B-2 Bomber and other advanced systems.

Mr. Hoerter received a BS in Astronautical Engineering at the United States Air Force Academy, and a MS in Engineering at UCLA. He is a graduate of the Air Force Test Pilot School and the Program Manager's Course at the Defense Systems Management College. Mr. Hoerter was a Command Pilot with more than 3500 flight hours in more than 20 different aircraft.
