### BEEP for electronics recycling in St. Louis

Boeing Employees for Environmental Protection (BEEP), a Boeing-sponsored club, encourages Boeing employees in the St. Louis area to participate in a recycling and reuse event this month.

On Sept. 20, BEEP will partner with Web Innovations and Technical Services (WITS) to recycle electronics,

in the 270G parking lot across Campus Parkway from the 270 building. Employees, retirees, and their families can drop off unwanted electronic equipment from 7:30 a.m. to 9 a.m. and between 3 p.m. and 5 p.m.

WITS is a St. Louis-based nonprofit corporation that specializes in reuse and recycling of electronic equipment. It rebuilds PCs using parts from donated systems for individuals and organizations unable to afford new equipment. It will

accept any items that run on electricity (except large appliances). It charges a donation fee of \$10 for each television and \$5 for each monitor, laptop and microwave oven.

This event is for personal items—not equipment with a Boeing property sticker.
