Boeing works together with these entities to strengthen the role of aerospace in Europe and in the global economy. The company also collaborates with them on sectoral issues such as safety and certification, the environment, cybersecurity, unmanned aircraft, fair competition, unmanned traffic management, defence and security cooperation.

Boeing directly employs more than 5,000 talented people across Europe. The company has directly delivered 4,600 commercial aircraft to more than 130 European customers in the last six decades, and Boeing's advanced defence platforms are in service with 23 European armed forces. Boeing's commercial, defence and services programmes support nearly 190,000 highly skilled jobs in Europe.

Boeing enhances European competitiveness by investing in the talent, skills and technologies offered by its scientists, engineers and technicians. Boeing is growing its local presence with new European facilities and partners performing cutting-edge work and by actively supporting environmental, educational and social programmes.

By continuing its partnership with European research institutions, nonprofit organisations (NGO), governments and local communities, Boeing helps build a more sustainable future. With innovative community partnerships all across Europe, Boeing is inspiring tomorrow's innovators and aerospace pioneers, ensuring they have the necessary 21st-century skills to solve critical scientific, environmental and societal challenges.

Boeing's dedication to future generations is manifested in its growing educational partnership and ongoing efforts to deliver the best performing, most efficient products and services in aviation.

In 2018, Boeing announced an investment of more than €4 million for additional pan-European science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) projects with NGO partner Newton Europe, an organisation dedicated to engaging future leaders and pioneers in STEM education.

The most recent demonstrations of this are the success of the Boeing-SAAB team, which won the U.S. Air Force's trainer aircraft competition with the all-new T-X trainer, and Leonardo and Boeing's MH-139 helicopter, which has been awarded for the U.S. Air Force's UH-1N Huey replacement.

In its second century, Boeing will further leverage its strategic partnerships across Europe to deliver best in industry to customers, governments and warfighters.

Commercial



Boeing Commercial Airplanes has an enduring presence in Europe as a major aircraft manufacturer for many European airlines:

- Deliveries: Boeing has directly delivered over 4,600 commercial aircraft to more than 130 European customers in the last six decades.
- Forecast: European airlines are forecast to acquire almost 9,000 new aircraft in the next 20 years.
- **Supply chain:** Boeing 737, 747, 767, 777 and 787 programmes boast breakthrough technologies and systems from hundreds of European suppliers.
- Launch customers: Several European airlines have partnered with Boeing to launch new aircraft models, including the Boeing 737, 747-8 and all-new 777X.
- Manufacturing: High-tech 737 and 767 components are manufactured in Sheffield, U.K.
- Passengers: Each year, Boeing aircraft carry 385 million passengers from Europe to destinations all over the world.

- Adient Aerospace: Joint venture between Boeing and Adient offers a portfolio of aircraft seats out of Germany.
- Aviall: Distributor of aircraft parts supplies chemicals, tools and materials, has offices in the Netherlands.
